libib is a **website & app** that catalogues media. We use it to catalogue **books, reports, and periodicals**.

The **tag function** makes searching even easier - you can search by topic for exactly what you need.

Patrons can also search by author, title, or year of publication.



GRANTMAKERS of Oregon and Southwest Washington maintains a resource library for our members because we know that having the right resources makes all the difference.

Our library is housed both in hard copy (in our office) and in digital form for ease of accessibility. Some of the materials in our library are proprietary to the publisher and cannot be taken out of the library. However, most are not, so we can send you the .pdf any time.

Our digital library catalogue is where you can search for resources - when you've found what you need, simply place a hold and we will send you the resources.

Find resources on diversity, equity, & inclusion (DEI)

Three easy steps to access resources



Searching by tags makes finding what you need simple. Go to gosw.libib.com and find the "Tag List" button in the upper right hand corner. Click on it and scroll down until you see the tag you want. Click on that and it will pull up the full list of resources we have used in past Grantmaking 101 courses.

Note that we have sorted our DEI resources into two buckets:
"**dei in philanthropy**" = resources about our sector & internal work
"**diversity equity inclusion**" = resources about funding DEI work



When you find resources you'd like to access, you can place a hold by logging in as a patron (click the "Patron Login" button on the left). Most of our members are already set up as patrons but need to request a password. If your email is not recognized, you can request to be set up by emailing info@gosw.org.

Alternatively, if you just need a few items, you can email us a list of titles.



We'll send you the resources you requested electronically, or you can come by and pick them up if you prefer a hard copy (or if it's a book or other resource that can't be shared electronically).

Members who live far from our offices can request we mail a book.
